

HOW A MOMENT CAN CHANGE YOU

There was a man who had two sons. The younger one said to his father, "Father, give me my share of the estate." So he divided his property between them. Not long after that, the younger son got together all he had, **set off for a distant country** and there squandered his wealth in wild living. *Luke 15:11-13*

After he had spent everything, there was **a severe famine** in that whole country, and **he began to be in need**. So he went and hired himself out to a citizen of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed pigs. He longed to fill his stomach with the pods that the pigs were eating, but **no one gave him anything**. *Luke 15:14-16*

DAILY MEDITATIONS

MONDAY

What point of this weekend's message hit home for you (awakening, honesty or action) and why? Please read Luke 15:11-16. What aha moments do you see in this passage? What aha moments have you encountered recently? Today, thank God for His amazing love for you! *Thank Him for the moments He has given you today. Pray that you will see your life through His eyes today.*

TUESDAY

Please read Luke 15:17. How does the Bible describe the prodigal son's aha moment? Recall a time recently when you feel like God brought you to your senses? How has that awakening impacted you? *Thank God today for the way He brings you to your senses. Pray for a heart that is willing to awaken to God's ways.*

WEDNESDAY

Read Luke 15:18-19. What honesty did the prodigal son see after his awakening? Spend some time in prayer today and ask God for the same type of honesty He gave the prodigal son. Write down some honest observations God has given you as He has awakened you recently. *Thank God today that He doesn't leave us to figure out life alone. Pray for a willingness to look honestly at your life and see the good and bad. Pray that God will use the awakenings in your life as the opportunity for honest evaluation.*

THURSDAY

Please read Luke 15:20a. Put yourself in the prodigal's shoes. What would it take to move from honesty to action? What would your fears be? As you think about how God has awakened you recently, what action can you take to ensure that the "aha moment" takes root in you? *Thank God today for the plan He has for you. Pray for courage to "get up" and take action.*

FRIDAY

Please read Deuteronomy 31:8 and Luke 15:20b. When "aha moments" come it can be scary, how do these verses encourage you? As you think about how God has awakened you recently, what action can you take to ensure that the "aha moment" takes root in you? *Thank God today for the plan He has for you. Pray for courage to "get up" and take action and the faith to believe He is always with you.*

SATURDAY

Please read Proverbs 11 and write down at least two pieces of wisdom in this proverb that strike you. *Thank God today for His word and the opportunity to study it. Please pray for the services this weekend, pray that our church will be a beacon of hope and light in our community.*
