DAILY MEDITATIONS BRIEF DAILY DEVOTIONS RELATED TO TODAY'S TOPIC

Monday

Read Rev. 4:1-3. The throne is one of the most frequent images in Revelation. Why is it important for the original readers, first-century Christians undergoing persecution, to see God on the throne? Why is it important for believers today? Thank God He is on the throne still!

Tuesday

Read Rev. 4:6-8. The creatures praise God for being "holy, holy, holy". Among other things, this means God is completely other. God is different, alien, far above our comprehension. How do people try to make God seem smaller and tamer? Why do you think we do this? How does thinking about the *otherness* of God inspire greater faith? *Thank God that He is holy, holy!*

Wednesday

Read Rev. 4:6-8 and Isaiah 6:1-7. Both Isaiah and John have similar visions of heaven. How do they respond similarly? (Compare Isaiah 6:5 with Rev. 5:3,4) Why do you suppose such a vision of God's holiness produced a sense of unworthiness? How does God respond to Isaiah and John? (Compare Isaiah 6:6,7 and Rev. 5:5) What does this tell you about God's mercy? *Thank God today for His mercy to you!*

Thursday

Read Rev. 4:9-11. This is a song praising God for His creative activity. Three times it points out that God is creative! Today, make a point of noticing God's creative work around you, and thank him specifically for creating things you see—and as the singers in Revelation do, thank Him for creating *you*!

Friday

Read Rev. 5:9-10. This third song is about what Jesus has done for us. What are the three things the singers praise him for? Today, thank the Lord for the same three things, which are true of you if you have received His mercy!

Saturday

Today read back over Revelation 4. What impresses you most about this chapter? Please pray for the weekend services, that God will be glorified. Thank you!
