DAILY MEDITATIONS BRIEF DAILY DEVOTIONS RELATED TO TODAY'S TOPIC

MONDAY Read Revelation 19:6-9. The idea of God as our husband is found throughout the Bible. Look up Isaiah 54:5. Then read how God's people respond in Isaiah 61:10. Why do you think God chooses to describe our relationship with the image of a passionate marriage? How is this different from the way people view "religion"? Thank God for his love for you today!

TUESDAY Read Revelation 19:7-8 carefully. It says, "His bride made herself ready." But it also says "fine linen, bright and clean, was given to her to wear." Which is it? She made herself ready? Or he gave her something that made her ready? It's the same tension found in Philippians 2:12-13: "Work out your own salvation"-- yet it is God "at work within you". Because of God's power at work within you, you are able to do good deeds and your life changes! Today ask God to work within you to do His will!

WEDNESDAY Read Revelation 19:11-15. Here Jesus is a warrior and a judge. Does it disturb you to read of the "wrath of God"? Human wrath is often a result of bad temper and character defects. But God's wrath is totally different. It is always perfectly just. What are other ways the "wrath of God" is different from the wrath of humans? The point of this passage: We long for the injustices of the world to be put right. And the Bible promises it will happen. Thank God today that when He judges, it will be totally just and true.

THURSDAY Read Revelation 19:16. Why is this description of Jesus so important in the Book of Revelation (think of the situation of the first century readers)? Every human being, no matter how important, has a King they serve. The only issue is whether we will face reality and choose to surrender to Him. As you go throughout your day, ask yourself: How can I surrender to the King and serve Him in each situation? Thank the King that he extends mercy and grace to you!

FRIDAY Look again at Rev. 19:15. The idea of the sword coming from his mouth means Jesus wins simply by speaking. That's how it's always been. He said, "Let there be light", and the universe started. He said "Peace be still" and the waves were calmed. He said, "Lazarus, come forth", and the dead man rose. The idea here is that the entire world system, with all its technology and weapons, is silenced—with one word from Jesus. For Christians, the takeaway is this: Jesus wins. And the outcome is never even in question. How does this encourage you today? Thank God for His promise of victory!
