Where does this sign point?

Daily Meditations

Memory Verse: Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters; and you who have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without cost.” Isaiah 55:1

Monday: If you could choose any miracle to kick off your new job or ministry, what would it be? Read John 2:1-11. What were the water jars used for? Why do you think this is significant? How does the quality and the quantity of the wine show Jesus' glory? Why do you think John calls this miracle a “sign” – what does it show about Jesus? *Thank God that he came to bring a rich banquet –to your life! If you are feeling low, ask Him to show you His feast!*

Tuesday: Reread John 2:1-11. How would you describe your life right now: 1.) I think the wine's starting to run out; 2.) The wine has run out completely; 3.) There's new wine available but I'm not drinking; 4.) I'm loving God's banquet! Read Isaiah 55. If this is the kind of life God has for us, then why are all believers not living it? *Give thanks to God for his invitation! Respond to it today.*

Wednesday: Read John 2:12-17. Keeping in mind what Jesus has told Nathanael (John 1:51) and how he lavished free wine on a party, why would he be offended at the scene at the temple? Jesus came to clear the way to God. What do we sometimes put in the way? *Ask God to clear away your own obstacles to faith.*

Thursday: Read Isaiah 25:6-9. How do you feel when you read these verses? What's the most appealing part of this description for you? Why do you suppose the Bible describes our future with God with earthy, sensual imagery about banquets – and not just in spiritual terms? *Thank God that, in Christ, you have this future to look forward to!*

Friday: Read Psalm 51:1-9. What is the writer longing for? Have you ever felt like this? Read Hebrews 10:19-22. According to these verses, can you be confident that you have been cleansed? *Thank God that He washes you clean!*
